

1. President Terry Taylor called the meeting to order at 4:58 p.m., and welcomed those in attendance.
2. President Terry Taylor led those in attendance in the flag salute.
3. Members of the Governing Board in attendance were: Terry Taylor, Marie Thomas, Susan Short, Walter Hancock, and Thomas Robertson.

Others present were: Sam Chimento, Kathleen Coleman, and Andee Farrar.

4. A motion was made by Thomas Robertson, seconded by Marie Thomas, recommending that the agenda be approved. Motion unanimously carried.

CLOSED SESSION

The Board recessed into closed session at 5:00 p.m. for the purpose of discussing Student Matters/Discipline, in accordance with Education Code Sections 48918 and 35146, regarding Expulsion Case No. 02/11/97, I.D. No. 11893.

OPEN SESSION

The Board reconvened into open session at 5:47 p.m.

REPORT ON ACTION(S) TAKEN IN CLOSED SESSION

No action was taken in closed session.

ACTIONS ITEMS

5. Action on Expulsion Case No. 02/11/97, I.D. No. 11893.

a. Action No. 1 - Finding of Fact.

A motion was made by Susan Short, seconded by Marie Thomas, that Student No. 02/11/97, I.D. no. 11893, did in fact violate Education Code Section 48900.4:

In addition to the grounds specified in Sections 48900 and 48900.2, a pupil enrolled in any of grades 4 to 12, inclusive, may be suspended from school or recommended for expulsion if the superintendent or the principal of the school in which the pupil is enrolled determines that the pupil has intentionally engaged in harassment, threats, or intimidation, directed against school district personnel or pupils, that is sufficiently severe or pervasive to have the actual and reasonably expected effect of materially disrupting classwork, creating substantial disorder, and invading the rights of either school personnel or pupils by creating an intimidating or hostile educational environment.

The Governing Board also found that other means of correction are not feasible or have repeatedly failed to bring about proper conduct. Due to the nature of the act, the presence of the pupil causes a continuing danger to the physical safety of the pupil or others.

Motion unanimously carried.

b. Action No. 2 – Action Pending Expulsion.

A motion was made by Susan Short, seconded by Marie Thomas, to expel Student No. 02/11/97, I.D. no. 11893 through the end of the 2009/2010 school year, and recommended the following rehabilitation plan:

- (1) The student participate in a counseling program approved by the Principal of Palermo School
- (2) The student remain off any school campus, until otherwise notified in writing by a school official (exception: during school hours at Palermo Community Day School site).

ACTIONS ITEMS

5. Action on Expulsion Case No. 02/11/97, I.D. No. 11893.
 - b. Action No. 2 – Action Pending Expulsion (continued)
 - (3) The student demonstrate proper respect to and follow all directions of school officials.
 - (4) The student demonstrate proper attitude toward school work, maintain a good attendance record, and demonstrate good school conduct with no disruptions.
 - (5) The student maintain a portfolio that contains evidence of improved achievement in math and reading, a sample of a completed assignment, and a sample or picture of a completed project.
 - (6) The student adhere to all laws and regulations, federal, state, and local, as a demonstration of rehabilitation success.

The student is referred to the Palermo Community Day School through the end of the 2009/2010 school year.

If the student is not successful at the Palermo Community Day School, the student may be reassigned to the Thermalito Community Day School for school attendance.

The student has permission to be on the Palermo School campus to participate in Little League Baseball. Permission to be on campus to participate in baseball is conditional on the student not receiving any serious discipline while attending the Palermo Community Day School.

The student may apply to the Palermo Union School District for readmission into the regular education program at the end of the 2009/2010 school year, June, 2010.

If the student successfully completes the recommended behavior plan and maintains proper respect and conduct, the Order of Expulsion may be expunged from the student's school records upon meeting requirements for graduation from the Palermo Union School District, subject to approval of the Governing Board.

Motion unanimously carried.

Committed an obscene act or engaged in habitual profanity or vulgarity.

Disrupted school activities or otherwise willfully defied the valid authority of supervisors, teachers, administrators, school officials, or other school personnel engaged in the performance of their duties.

The Governing Board also found that other means of correction are not feasible or have repeatedly failed to bring about proper conduct.
