1. Vice President Susan Short called the meeting to order at 5:06 p.m., and welcomed those in attendance.
2. Vice President Susan Short led those in attendance in the flag salute.
3. Members of the Governing Board in attendance were: Susan Short, Terry Taylor, and Thomas Robertson. Walter Hancock and Marie Thomas was absent.

Others present were: Sam Chimento and Kathleen Coleman.

4. A motion was made by Thomas Robertson, seconded by Terry Taylor, recommending that the agenda be approved. Motion unanimously carried.

CLOSED SESSION

The Board recessed into closed session at 5:07 p.m. for the purpose of discussing Student Matters/Discipline, in accordance with Education Code Sections 49073 and 49076, regarding Expulsion Case No. 5/12/92, I.D. No. 61016.

OPEN SESSION

The Board reconvened into open session at 5:45 p.m.

REPORT ON ACTION(S) TAKEN IN CLOSED SESSION

No action was taken in closed session.

ACTIONS ITEMS

5. Action on Expulsion Case No. 5/12/92, ID No. 61016.

- a. Action No. 1 - Finding of Fact.

A motion was made by Terry Taylor, seconded by Thomas Robertson, that Student No. 5/12/92, I.D. No. 61016 did in fact, violate Education Code Section 48900 (f):

Caused or attempted to cause damage
to school property or private property.

The Governing Board also found that other means of correction have not been successful to bring about proper conduct.

Motion unanimously carried.

b. Action No. 2 - Action Pending Expulsion.

A motion was made by Thomas Robertson, seconded by Terry Taylor, to expel Student No. 5/12/92, I.D. No. 61016 for the remainder of the 2005/2006 school year, and recommended the following rehabilitation plan:

- (1) The student participate in a counseling program approved by the Principal of Palermo School. Parent counseling is recommended.
- (2) The student remain off any school campus, until otherwise notified in writing by a school official (exception: during school hours at Eastside School site).
- (3) The student demonstrate proper respect to and follow all directions of school officials.
- (4) The student demonstrate proper attitude toward school work, maintain a good attendance record, and demonstrate good school conduct with no disruptions.
- (5) The student adhere to all laws and regulations, federal, state, and local, as a demonstration of rehabilitation success.

The student is referred to the Palermo Community Day School Program for the remainder of the 2005/2006 school year for school attendance. Failure to enroll and attend the Palermo Community Day School Program will result in the Expulsion Order remaining in force.

If the student successfully completes the freshman year in high school by showing evidence of good school work and citizenship, the student may, in June 2007, request to have the Order of Expulsion expunged from the student's school records, subject to approval of the Governing Board.

Motion unanimously carried.

A motion was made by Thomas Robertson, seconded by Terry Taylor, that Student No. 3/16/94, ID No. 82114, did in fact, violate Education Code Section 48900 (f):

Caused or attempted to cause damage to school property or private property.

The Governing Board also found that other means of correction have not been successful to bring about proper conduct.

- (1) The student participate in a counseling program approved by the Principal of Palermo School. Parent counseling is recommended.
- (2) The student remain off any school campus, until otherwise notified in writing by a school official (exception: during school hours at Eastside School site).
- (3) The student demonstrate proper respect to and follow all directions of school officials.
- (4) The student demonstrate proper attitude toward school work, maintain a good attendance record, and demonstrate good school conduct with no disruptions.
- (5) The student adhere to all laws and regulations, federal, state, and local, as a demonstration of rehabilitation success.

The student is referred to the Palermo Community Day School Program for the remainder of the 2005/2006 school year for school attendance.

The expulsion will be suspended through the first trimester of the 2006/2007 school year, and the student will be placed on a Behavior Contract developed by the Principal of Palermo School. If the contract is violated, the suspension of the expulsion will be voided and the student will be referred to the Palermo Community Day School Program for the first trimester of the 2006/2007 school year for school attendance. If referred to the Palermo Community Day School Program, readmission to Palermo School at the end of the first trimester would be contingent upon Board approval.

If the student successfully completes the recommended behavior plan and maintains proper respect and conduct, the Order of Expulsion may be expunged from the student's school records upon meeting requirements for graduation from the Palermo Union School District, subject to approval of the Governing Board.

Motion unanimously carried.

Caused or attempted to cause damage to school property or private property.

The Governing Board also found that other means of correction have not been successful to bring about proper conduct.
